### Charges Next Year

We have reviewed our charges for September and unfortunately we need to make some slight increases. Over the last couple of years we have absorbed the additional costs of utilities and food provisions and kept charges the same, but sadly this is no longer sustainable.

**Breakfast Club**—£4 a session (no need to book a place from now on, you can just turn up).

**Keys Club**— £8 a session. Booking required, a week's notice of cancellations (by 6pm). Full Ts&Cs online for Keys Club.

**School Dinners** (free for Infants) - £2.45 per 2 course meal.

Also the after school **Sports Clubs** charges being made to school have significantly increased so we can no longer continue to fund these entirely, therefore we are making a small charge for these of just £2 for the 1 hour weekly sessions. More information to follow in September.
